The matches were arranged as follows: Ingersoll vs. Ann Arbor Juniors; Hamilton vs. Port Huron; Woodstock vs. Alleghany, Pa. It is expected that the Tournament will not close until Tuesday next. To-day the attendance on the ground numbered quite four thousand. There is the greatest excitement on account of the international matches. Ingersoll beat the Ann Arbor Juniors 40 to 25. Hamilton best the Welkin Clab, of Port Huron. The following is the score of the Hamilton players: Mason, 3; Nicolls, 3; Young, 3; Shuttleworth, 2; McCann, 2; Secord, 2; Atkinson, 2; Sweetman, 1; Sunicy, 1; total, 19. The Welkin Club made only 10, giving the game to Hamilton by a majority of 9 .--The Welkins played three innings, Hamilton two, and six runs on third, no men being out, when, the Welkin's pitcher being disabled, they gave up the game. The Woodstock Club was beaten by the Alleghanies 55 to 35. The death of Mr. Harris, of the Woodstock Club has very materially weakened their force.
