

A Visit to the Young Canadians.

Wednesday last having been proclaimed our annual Civic Holiday, the "Tecumseh" base ball club of this city took advantage of it and at 8:45 a.m., left here for Woodstock, to engage in a friendly contest with the champions of Canada. Arrived there, the party, numbering about thirty, were met at the station by several of the members, who escorted them to the "Caister House," where ample preparation had been made for their reception. The game had been called for two o'clock, and at that hour both clubs were prompt on the ground. The "Canadians" was the tone, and went to the bat, and succeeded in scoring 2 runs. The "Tecumsehs" then relieved them, and went out for 5 runs. In the subsequent innings, the playing of both clubs was very spirited and the game was hotly contested throughout, the superior fielding of the champions being particularly noticeable. The best of good feeling prevailed during the game, and fun and hilarity were indulged in by both sides. The match terminated at 7 o'clock, after five hours good play, in a victory for the champions by 43 runs. Refreshments were on the ground, furnished by Mr. Robert Thacker, their caterer. The members and friends of the "Tecumseh" were then invited to dine with the "Young Canadians" at "Caister's," which was readily accepted, and at which a very pleasant and agreeable time was spent. The umpire, Mr. John McKay, of Woodstock, received a vote of thanks from both clubs for his impartial decisions throughout, which was very justly merited. The champions accompanied the party to the station, and gave three cheers for the Londoners, which were returned and echoed as the train moved off. Altogether the day was spent in a most friendly and sociable manner, and we are sure the "Tecumsehs" will not soon forget the hospitality and kindness shown them on their first visit to the "Young Canadians."
