FLOWER CITY OF BRUNSWICK VS. TECUMSEH OF TORONTO.

The tour of these New York State ball players has, since their entrance into Canada, been one of unobstructed success, although hardly successful in certain lines. They have defeated thus far, the Nationals of Hamilton, the Independents of Dundas, and the Tecumsehs of this city. The match played here yesterday afternoon was well and hotly contested by both, and at one time the odds seemed to be in favor of the Tecumsehs. The pitcher, catcher, and first base of the latter club were absent, their places being filled by substitutes from junior clubs, who, it must be mentioned, played very well. The game was short of a large share of interest by this occasion, and might have resulted differently had those players been in their places. In the third inning the catcher of the Tecumsehs sprained his wrist in attempting a difficult foul ball, which hindered him comparatively unless during the remaining innings. This was to be regretted, as up to that time the game had been very much exciting and vigorously contested, the Tecumsehs being the favorites. The latter innings were also characterized by good play, on the part of both clubs. Three white-washes were administered to the Tecumsehs, and two to the Flower City. Mr. E. M. Moore umpired satisfactorily. The members of the latter club are gentlemanly, and won the respect and esteem of the spectators by their coolness and urbanity throughout the match. They play Woodstock to-day, Gravelly to-morrow, and Maple Leaf of Hamilton on Saturday. We hope their first "invasion" through Western Canada may prove instructive and highly remunerative to them.
