— MOUNT FOREST, Oct 10.

The Normanby by-law, granting \$50,000 aid to the Wellington, Grey and Bruce Railway via Harriston or Mount Forest, has been carried by a majority of 387.

**SUPPOSED TO HAVE FOUNDERED.**

— COLLINGWOOD, Oct. 10.

The schooner *John H. Drake* with a cargo of corn from Chicago. W. H. Boyce commander, reports that to the eastward of the Ducks about 15 miles, a black fire, and aft schooner, steering for Cove Island is supposed to have foundered on Wednesday morning, during a heavy westward gale, she was within a mile of the Drake when a heavy sea swept the Drake, carrying away bulworks and boats, and in an hour after daylight appearing, nothing could be seen of her from the mast head with the glass. She carried 3 gibs, and was about a 13,000 bushels vessel, appeared heavy laden.
