ROYAL CANADIAN BANK.

WHITBY, June 18.

A large and influential meeting of the Stockholders of the Royal Canadian Bank, was held here this evening. Mr. James McGee, of King, who was present, was requested to address the meeting. The remarks made by him, as to the evil management that had brought about the present disastrous state of affairs and the remedy necessary to be applied by the Stockholders if they wished the Bank ever to resume its position amongst the Monetary Institutions of Western Canada, seemed to elicit the unanimous approval of the meeting. DEATH OF H. J. RAYMOND.

We regret to learn that Mr. H. J. Raymond, editor of the *New York Times*, died suddenly in New York, yesterday morning. He was of delicate constitution, but no mention has been made of recent sickness suffered by him. Mr. Raymond was one of the ablest journalists in the United States. Although a Republican politician holding advanced views on slavery, and some other questions, he was essentially moderate and conservative, and always courteous and dignified in his public utterances. His journal is the best exponent in the daily New York press of the conservative religious element in American society.
